BACKGROUND

This position will teach into the Bachelor of Design Futures Visual Communication major and convene the Master of Digital Design Program within the Queensland College of Art at the South Bank campus. - Ability to participate in the administration of the college.
- Ability to develop collaborative relations and dialogue with industry.
- A highly developed understanding of, and ability to teach, software in an industry context.

- Demonstrated ability to supervise honours level and other postgraduate student projects.
